First Sunday after the Epiphany THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

Theme of the day: The long-expected Christ has arrived; the waiting is over as the Son of David is anointed. The Father's approval sounds from heaven and book-ends the season of Epiphany, when with the Holy Spirit and with power it thunders again on the Mount of Transfiguration as the Son is revealed in glory.

□ All Who Believe and Are Baptized (CW 299)

All who believe and are baptized
Shall see the Lord's salvation;
Baptized into the death of Christ,
They are a new creation.
Through Christ's redemption They shall stand
Among the glorious, heav'nly band
Of ev'ry tribe and nation.

CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION (reflecting on our baptisms)

- M: You and I were baptized in the name of the Triune God.
- C: Today we reflect on the meaning of our own baptisms, considering once again what God has done for us in that blessed sacrament.
- M: God's holy Word reminds us that Baptism is not a mere, outward ceremony, but "the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:5)."
- C: Baptism is the vital life of the Christian, for we were "sinners from birth (Psalm 51:5)", and like the rest of fallen mankind, we were by nature objects of God's wrath (Ephesians 2:3)."
- M: But in Baptism, we died, dying to sin and its eternal consequences.
- C: "All of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death (Romans 6:3)."
- M: The Bible also tells us that in Baptism we were born again, being made alive by faith in Jesus.
- C: "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life (Romans 6:4)."
- M: How can the water of Baptism do such wonderful things?
- C: Baptism is not just plain water, but it is water used by God's command and connected with God's Word. So it is certainly not the water that does such things, but God's Word which is in and with the water.
- M: Therefore, what blessings do we receive?
- C: Baptism works forgiveness of sins, delivers from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

M: Brothers and sisters, be at peace, for "you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus; for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ (Galatians 3:26,27)."

C: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

M: Father in heaven, at the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan you proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit. Keep us who are baptized into Christ faithful in our calling as your children and make us heirs with him of everlasting life; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Listen to me, you coastlands. Pay attention, you faraway peoples! The LORD called me from the womb.

⁵But now the Lord,


who formed me from the womb to be his servant, to turn Jacob back to him,

SECOND LESSON: Acts 16:25-34

²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. Instantly all the doors were opened, and everyone's chains came loose. ²⁷When the jailer woke up and saw that the prison doors were opened, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, because he thought that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul shouted with a loud voice, "Don't harm yourself, because we are all here!"

²⁹The jailer called for lights, rushed in, and fell down trembling in front of Paul and Silas. ³⁰Then he brought them outside and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

³¹They said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, you and your household." ³²They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to everyone in his home. ³³At the same hour of the night, he took them and washed their wounds. Without delay, he and all his family were baptized. ³⁴Then he brought Paul and Silas into his house and set food before them. He rejoiced, because he and his whole household had come to believe in God.

VERSE OF THE DAY

M: Alleluia. Alleluia. You are my Son, whom I love. I am well pleased with you. Alleluia! (Mark 1:11)

C: JAlleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! These words are written that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

GOSPEL LESSON: Mark 1:4-11

⁴John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him. They were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, and he wore a leather belt around his waist. He ate locusts and wild honey. He preached, "One more powerful than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the strap of his sandals! I baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰Just as Jesus came up out of the water, he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love. I am well pleased with you."

The Father's word, the Spirit's flight Anointed Christ in glorious sight As God's own choice, from Adam's fall To save the world and free us all. Now rise, faint hearts: be resolute! This man is Christ, our substitute! He was baptized in Jordan's stream, Proclaimed Redeemer, Lord supreme.

SERMON: Psalm 2

¹Why do the nations rage? Why do the peoples grumble in vain? ²The kings of the earth take a stand, and the rulers join together

against the LORD and against his Anointed One.

³"Let us tear off their chains and throw off their ropes from us."

⁴The one who is seated in heaven laughs. The Lord scoffs at them.

⁵Then he speaks to them in his anger, and in his wrath he terrifies them.

⁶"I have installed my King on Zion, my holy mountain."

⁷I will proclaim the decree of the LORD.

He said to me: "You are my Son. Today I have begotten you.

⁸Ask me,

and I will give you the nations as your inheritance and the ends of the earth as your possession.

⁹You will smash them with an iron rod.

You will break them to pieces like pottery."

¹⁰So now, you kings, do what is wise.

Accept discipline, you judges of the earth.

11Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling.

¹²Kiss the Son, or he will be angry,

and you will be destroyed in your way,

for his wrath can flare up in a moment.

How blessed are all who take refuge in him.

THE THIRD ARTICLE of the APOSTLES' CREED
