

FIRST LESSON: Genesis 11:1-9

SECOND LESSON: Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ²Suddenly a sound like the rushing of a violent wind came from heaven, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³They saw divided tongues that were like fire resting on each one of them. ⁴They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, since the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak fluently.

THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

Are you ready and willing to confess your faith before the Triune God and those who are worshiping with you today? I am.

Do you believe in God the Father?

Yes, (with the congregation) I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Yes, (with the congregation) I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Yes, (with the congregation) I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Christian Church, the Communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.
