- M: God, our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins. By the miraculous birth, the perfect life and the innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, he has removed your guilt forever. You are his own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to his will.
- C: (Spoken) Amen
 - Now through his Son doth shine the Father's grace divine. Death was reigning o'er un through sin and vanity till he opened for us a bright eternity. May we praise him there! May we praise him there!

Hebrews 1:1-9
