WELCOME



- M: We are in the presence of the true and living God, before whom all angels veil their faces and bow in humble adoration.
- C: We acknowledge his glory as the only true God, and we offer to him the praise of our hearts and our lips.
- M: Let all the earth stand in awe of our God, who has visited and redeemed his people.
- C: Blessing and honor and glory and power be to our God forever and ever! Amen.

(Introduction is played, and then congregation sings:)

- Come from on high to me; I cannot rise to thee. Cheer my wearied spirit, O pure and holy Child; thro' thy grace and merit, blest Jesus, Lord most mild, draw me unto thee! Draw me unto thee!
- M: Beloved in the Lord! In the beauty of this glorious celebration of our Savior's birth, our sins against a pure and holy God are still evident. Let us come before Him to make confession and be assured of His forgiveness.
- C: Be gracious to me, God, according to your mercy. Erase my acts of rebellion according to the greatness of your compassion. Scrub me clean from my guilt. Purify me from my sin. For I admit my rebellious acts. My sin is always in front of me.
- M: God, our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins. By the miraculous birth, the perfect life and the innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, he has removed your guilt forever. You are his own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to his will.
- C: (Spoken) Amen
 - Now through his Son doth shine the Father's grace divine. Death was reigning o'er us through sin and vanity till he opened for us a bright eternity.

 May we praise him there! May we praise him there!

PRAYER FOR THE DAY:

All: Almighty God, we thank you for the birth of your Son in the flesh that sets us free from our old bondage under the yoke of sin and the law. Give us your Holy Spirit to help us rejoice in the peace you have provided for us. We ask this in the name of our Savior who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit as one God, now and forever. Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT READING: Micah 5:2-5

²But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, from you, will go out the one who will be the ruler for me in Israel.

³Therefore the LORD will give them up, until the time when the woman who is in labor bears a child. Then the remaining survivors from his brothers will return to the people of Israel.

EPISTLE READING: Galatians 4:4-7

⁴But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son to be born of a woman, so that he would be born under the law, ⁵in order to redeem those under the law, so that we would be adopted as sons. ⁶And because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts to shout, "*Abba*, Father!" ⁷So you are no longer a slave, but a son. And if you are a son, then you are also an heir of God through Christ.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

We believe, teach, and confess that God's Son from eternity has been a particular, distinct, entire, divine person. Yet He is true, essential, perfect God with the Father and the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time He received also the human nature into the unity of His person. He did not do this in such a way that there are now two persons or two Christs. Christ Jesus is now in one person at the same time true, eternal God, born of the Father from eternity, and a true man, born of the most blessed Virgin Mary.

We believe, teach, and confess that now, in this one undivided person of Christ, there are two distinct natures: the divine, which is from eternity, and the human, which in time was received into the unity of the person of God's Son. These two natures in the person of Christ are never either separated from or mingled with each other. Nor are they changed into each other. Each one abides in its nature and essence in the person of Christ to all eternity.

On account of this personal union and communion of the natures, Mary, the most blessed Virgin, did not bear a mere man. But, as the angel testifies, she bore a man who is truly the Son of the most high God. He did all his miracles by the power of this personal union. For example: In death, when He died not simply as any other man, but in and with His death conquered sin, death, devil, hell, and eternal damnation.

Now He has ascended to heaven. He also truly fills all things, being present everywhere, not only as God, but also as man. Since in the Holy Scriptures Christ is called a mystery upon which all heretics dash their heads, we admonish all Christians not to arrogantly indulge their reason in crafty investigations about such mysteries. They should simply believe, and rejoice without ceasing in the fact that our flesh and blood is placed so high at the right hand of God's majesty and almighty power. In this way we will certainly find constant consolation in every difficulty and remain well guarded against deadly error. (Formula of Concord, Article VIII)
