<sup>24</sup>You did not purchase fragrant cane for me with silver or satisfy me with the fat from your sacrifices.


Instead you have made me serve because of your sins.

# SECOND LESSON: 2 Corinthians 1:18-22

<sup>18</sup>As surely as God is faithful, our message to you is not "Yes" and "No." <sup>19</sup>For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us (by me, Silas, and Timothy), was not "Yes" and "No," but in him the "Yes" stands firm. <sup>20</sup>In fact, as many promises as God has made, they have always been "Yes" in him. For that reason we also say "Amen" through him to the glory of God.

<sup>21</sup>God is the one who makes both us and you to be strong in Christ. He anointed us. <sup>22</sup>He sealed us as his own and gave us the Spirit as the down payment in our hearts.

#### SERMON: Mark 2:1-12

When Jesus again entered Capernaum some days later, people heard that he was home. <sup>2</sup>So many people were gathered together that there was no more room, not even by the door, and he was speaking the word to them. <sup>3</sup>Some people came to him bringing a paralyzed man, carried by four men. <sup>4</sup>Since they could not bring the man to Jesus because of the crowd, they dug through the roof above where he was. When they had made an opening, they lowered the stretcher on which the paralyzed man was lying. <sup>5</sup>When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven."

<sup>6</sup>But there were some experts in the law sitting there and thinking in their hearts, <sup>7</sup>"Why does this fellow speak like this? He is

blaspheming! Who can forgive sins except God alone?"

<sup>8</sup>Jesus immediately knew in his spirit that they were thinking this way within themselves. He asked them, "Why are you thinking these things in your hearts? <sup>9</sup>Which is easier: to tell the paralyzed man, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, take your stretcher, and walk'? <sup>10</sup>But, so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the paralyzed man, <sup>11</sup>"I tell you, get up, take your stretcher, and go home."

<sup>12</sup>At once the man got up, picked up the stretcher, and went out in front of everyone. So they were all amazed and glorified God.

They said, "We have never seen anything like this!"

#### NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Holy Communion, will be celebrated in today's service. The Bible teaches us that Jesus offers us his body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins in the Lord's Supper. The Bible also instructs us that receiving the Lord's Supper together is a public expression of our complete "oneness," or unity of faith.

Because the Lord's Supper is an expression of our unity in faith, we invite to the Lord's Supper only those who have expressed that unity with us through membership in our congregation or one of our sister congregations in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS), or our sister church body, the ELS.

If you are a guest from another Christian church, we kindly ask that you simply refrain from participation in our celebration of the Lord's Supper today. We don't want to be presumptuous and put you in the position of declaring your agreement with our beliefs before you have had a chance to learn more.

# **Christian Questions**

prepared by Dr. Martin Luther for those who intend to go to the Sacrament

- 1. Do you believe that you are a sinner? Yes, I believe it. I am a sinner.
- 2. How do you know this?

From the Ten Commandments, which I have not kept.

# 3. Are you sorry for your sins?

Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God.

# 4. What have you deserved from God because of your sins?

His wrath and displeasure, temporal death, and eternal damnation. See Romans 6:21, 23.

- **5.** Do you hope to be saved? Yes, that is my hope.
- **6.** In whom then do you trust? In my dear Lord Jesus Christ.
- **7. Who is Christ?** The Son of God, true God and man.

# 8. How many Gods are there?

Only one, but there are three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

# 9. What has Christ done for you that you trust in Him?

He died for me and shed His blood for me on the cross for the forgiveness of sins.

# 10. Did the Father also die for you?

He did not. The Father is God only, as is the Holy Spirit; but the Son is both true God and true man. He died for me and shed His blood for me.

# 11. How do you know this?

From the holy Gospel, from the words instituting the Sacrament, and by His body and blood given me as a pledge in the Sacrament.

#### 12. What are the words of institution?

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

# 13. Do you believe, then, that the true body and blood of Christ are in the Sacrament? Yes, I believe it.

# 14. What convinces you to believe this?

The word of Christ: Take, eat, this is My body; drink of it, all of you, this is My blood.

# 15. What should we do when we eat His body and drink His blood, and in this way receive His pledge?

We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His blood, as He taught us: This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.

# 16. Why should we remember and proclaim His death?

First, so that we may learn to believe that no creature could make satisfaction for our sins. Only Christ, true God and man, could do that. Second, so we may learn to be horrified by our sins, and to regard them as very serious.

Third, so we may find joy and comfort in Christ alone, and through faith in Him be saved.

# 17. What motivated Christ to die and make full payment for your sins? His great love for His Father and for me and other sinners, as it is written in John 14; Romans 5; Galatians 2; and Ephesians 5.

# 18. Finally, why do you wish to go to the Sacrament?

That I may learn to believe that Christ, out of great love, died for my sin, and also learn from Him to love God and my neighbor.

# 19. What should admonish and encourage a Christian to receive the Sacrament frequently?

First, both the command and the promise of Christ the Lord. Second, his own pressing need, because of which the command, encouragement, and promise are given.

# 20. But what should you do if you are not aware of this need and have no hunger and thirst for the Sacrament?

To such a person no better advice can be given than this: first, he should touch his body to see if he still has flesh and blood. Then he should believe what the Scriptures say of it in Galatians 5 and Romans 7. Second, he should look around to see whether he is still in the world, and remember that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say in John 15–16 and in 1 John 2 and 5.

Third, he will certainly have the devil also around him, who with his lying and murdering day and night will let him have no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in John 8 and 16; 1 Peter 5; Ephesians 6; and 2 Timothy 2.
