

Thought for the day: The traditional symbol for Thanksgiving is the cornucopia or horn of plenty. In Roman mythology, Copia was the goddess of abundance who carried a horn filled with fruits and drinks. The early church took over that symbol and gave it a Christian meaning. The cornucopia symbolizes God's blessings in our lives—blessings that are never exhausted. The horn also signifies the song of thanks that sounds from our lips continually.






